



Fine Arts Coordinator Position

This role was established to help coordinate and organize these new initiatives as well as ones that already existed.

Increase Fine Arts presence on the Regina Dominican website that highlights Fine Arts curriculum, student work, and teacher philosophy.

Further increase Fine Arts public visibility

through social media, articles, etc., with the help of the Marketing department. This would include curating a larger photo gallery for Fine Arts to use for marketing. All of this leading to an increase in attendance of events.

Support growth in ACT and GAINS scores

through the increase of reading and writing components in the Fine Arts courses. This process has already begun.

Increase numbers of students able to take
Fine Arts courses by providing more
information on our current courses as well as
some strategies outlined in the "Challenges &
Opportunities" section.

Continue work on data collection to establish a baseline for continued data collection.

Current strategies include streamlining course evaluations through Google Forms, working with Diane Garvey to create recent alumnae surveys, and working with Student Services to better gauge student interest and college readiness.

Challenge: As we strive to improve our program and produce students with exceptional talent and skills, we are hindered by the current graduation requirement and scheduling conflicts that the saturated curriculum presents. Freshman and Sophomores essentially have to take a summer course in order to fit a Fine Arts into their schedule. The struggle also lies in that because of scheduling, students often take courses inconsistently, so skill-building goes out of practice.

Opportunities: Introducing a Fine Arts track, where graduation requirements can be altered in favor of more Fine Arts classes throughout their high school curriculum. Or, raise the Fine Arts graduation requirement for all incoming students.

Challenge: To remain competitive and to give the students more challenging courses, we would like to add more Honors or Advanced Placement courses. This is difficult with the current schedule, limitations of single faculty content areas, and graduation requirements.

Opportunity: This could be difficult with current limitations, but the Fine Arts department is working on reorganizing current curriculum to add more Advanced Placement content till a more permanent solution can be developed.

Challenge: The Dance Studio has a 15 person capacity. The wall also stops 3/4 of the way up, making it challenging for things to happen in the Activity Center and Dance Studio at the same time.

Opportunity: Renovate the Dance Studio to go all the way to the window in order to allow more girls into dance classes.
